What does this project involve?

This project includes transforming the current roadway into a modern pedestrian friendly roadway which will incorporate complete streets elements that will enable safe access for all people including pedestrians, bicyclists, motorists and transit riders of all ages and The reconstruction will include abilities. drainage improvements, new curbing, pavement, shared bicycle lanes, sidewalks, new ADA compliant concrete curb ramps, crosswalks, street crossing signs, new street trees and other street amenities. In addition, this project will also include the replacement of the existing lead water services along Manning Boulevard which is discussed further in this newsletter.

The project will also include new "green infrastructure" to manage storm water collection and treatment.

Who is doing the work and what is the schedule

The contractor performing the work will be determined when the bids are opened on April 8, 2025. It is assumed that they will begin to mobilize on site in mid May 2025. The project will be completed in the fall of 2025.

Will pedestrians, bicyclists & vehicles be allowed through the work areas?

Yes. It is very important that all types of traffic are allowed to safely go through the work areas at all times. This includes police, fire, and other emergency services, vehicles, bus service, delivery services, bicyclists, and pedestrians. As with any type of construction project, there will be inconveniences to the public, but the project was designed to help keep these inconveniences to a minimum. At no time will any building access be restricted as a result of the construction. Parking lane restrictions will be necessary, but the contract specifically limits the amount of on-street parking that can be closed at any one time. It will also be necessary to close sidewalks during some construction operations, but the project will be phased to close one section at a time and signed pedestrian walkways will be in place to safely direct people around the work site.

When will the Contractor be working?

Typical work hours/days for the contractor and utility companies are:

- Monday thru Friday between 7:00 am and 7:00 pm.

 Weekend and nighttime work is not anticipated. It will only be allowed for special circumstances, and only when approved by the City.

Lead Water Service Line Replacement

The Albany Water Board is committed to help homeowners replace their lead water service lines. Lead is no longer a suitable material for pipes and should be removed completely to mitigate associated health risks. As part of this project, it is proposed to remove and replace the existing lead water services from the main to the house meter at no cost to the homeowner. Home owners will be contacted by the City of Albany Water Department and will be provided with further details regarding this operation.
